African Ambassadors Inspect Yokohama's Waste Disposal Facilities

To pave the way for the "African Clean Cities Platform" preparatory meeting held in Maputo, Mozambique on April 25th through 27th, an inspection tour of Yokohama's waste disposal facilities was conducted for the ambassadors of several African nations to Japan.



The group toured the Tsurumi Incineration Plant, which handles combustible garbage collected in the city, and the Tsurumi Recycling Center, where aluminum and steel cans, glass bottles, and certain plastic bottles are sorted for reuse. Afterwards, Mayor Hayashi and President Kajimura greeted the ambassadors.



Delegates from Singapore Attended a Sustainability Conference in Yokohama

As part of the 11th Executive Development & Growth Exchange (EDGE) Programme, a delegation of thirty junior government officers from Singapore attended a conference on the theme of Sustainable City Development and toured Yokohama's Minato Mirai 21 and Kohoku New Town areas on Monday, April 17th.

The Yokohama International Affairs Bureau and Urban Development Bureau introduced to the delegates the history of Yokohama's rapidly growing population, traffic congestion, uncontrolled pollution, and other issues that necessitated city planning. Following the briefings, the group visited the flagship Minato Mirai 21 and Kohoku New Town districts that embody the city's philosophies and initiatives on sustainability.



Seizing these opportunities to learn from each other about administration dilemmas we have shared will allow our cities to realize the ideal of "growing together with the world" through continued urban development.
